Public transport is more challenging but can be accommodated and we will try to help any member wishing to travel by trains/buses/taxis.

It takes at least 20 pairs of hands to make every piece of Denby and our Denby factory tour will take you on a journey around each area of our fascinating pottery, seeing our highly skilled craftspeople at work as you go.

Chat to the skilled workers as you watch how they use time-honoured skills, finessed over 200 years, to transform locally sourced Derbyshire clay into the famous Denby Pottery that you know and love.

Discover why Denby Pottery is so versatile, beautiful, and durable, get to know why It takes approximately two weeks to create a single piece, and learn some quirky pottery making terms, such as sponging, jollying, and fettling along the way in this unforgettable experience.

A degree of flexibility will be required for this meeting, there are only 4 tour guides with a maximum of 8 people per guide, so we may ask for the partners to do the tour in the afternoon. After the tour our Lunch & Technical Session will be held in the room above the Bourne's Coffee Shop & Bistro (no. 4 on the map below), this is where registration and handing out of name badges will take place. On site at the Pottery Village there is plenty to do and see, with a museum, farm shop, garden shop, craft studio and of course the Denby pottery shop where you can purchase firsts and seconds. We

The address for the venue is: Denby Pottery Village, Derby Road, Denby, Derbyshire, DE5 8NX.

The Denby Pottery Village is situated 8 miles north of Derby and 2 miles south of Ripley in the Amber Valley region of Derbyshire.

By road: Junction 28 of the M1 is approximately 10 miles to the north (take the A38). Junction 26 of the M1 is approximately 10 miles to the south (take the A610 to Ripley). We are situated in a rural location on the B6179.

By air: The nearest airport is East Midlands Airport, www.nottinghamema.com

By rail: The nearest main train station is Derby or Belper, www.eastmidlandstrains.co.uk

By bus: There is a bus stop right outside the Pottery www.trentbuses.co.uk

There are many local hotels and B&Bs in the Derbyshire area and members are advised to use their favourite accommodation search engine to find their place of choice. #### Post-ATM Tour.

No specific event has been planned for the Friday morning however as Belper is close to the Peak District and Historical Derbyshire there are many things to do or places to visit these include the following:


- 1. Take a steam train ride from Duffield to Wirksworth on the Ecclesbourne steam railway (3 miles from Belper).
- 2. Take a tram at the Crich Tramway museum (5 miles)
- 3. Take a cable car ride to the Heights of Abraham and visit the lead mines (9 miles)
- 4. Visit Cromford Mills, birth place of the factory system (9 miles).
- 5. Walk around Carsington Water (10 miles)
- 6. Visit a Historic House and Gardens at Chatsworth (18 miles)
- 7. Go for a hike in the Peak District, my favourite is from Grindleford Station, walk up Padley Gorge along Burbage Brook to Longshaw Estate, cross the moorland via Owler Tor to Surprise View car park then back through Lawrence Field and Bole Hill quarry to see the remains of the millstone industry and experience the surreal feeling of the Silver Birch woods before ending up back at Grindleford Station.
